Based upon your request regarding Directive 2015/863:

The Directive 2015/863, on the restriction of the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment will apply to any equipment for use or import into an EU member state beginning July 22, 2019. RoHS 3 adds four additional restricted substances (phthalates) to the list of six included in RoHS 2 and are highlighted below in bold. The ten restricted substances include:

Cadmium (0.01 %)
Lead (0.1 %)
Mercury (0.1 %)
Hexavalent chromium (0.1 %)
Polybrominated biphenyls (PBB) (0.1 %)
Polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDE) (0.1 %)
Bis(2-ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP) (0.1 %)
Butyl benzyl phthalate (BBP) (0.1 %)
Dibutyl phthalate (DBP) (0.1 %)
Diisobutyl phthalate (DIBP) (0.1 %)

*Lead is often used as an alloying element and is exempt in steel up to .35% by weight, in aluminum up to .4% by weight, and in copper alloys up to 4% by weight.

To the best of our knowledge, Polyconn has met the RoHS 3 guidelines and are not intentionally manufactured or formulated with the above listed substances. Additionally, the product(s) were manufactured to customer specifications.

Please be advised that Polyconn does not analyze for these substances.
